1 - STATEMENT RELEASED BY THE CENTRAL ORGANIZING COMMITTEE OF THE AMERICAN COMMUNIST WORKERS MOVEMENT (MARXIST-LENINIST) ON THE OCCASION OF THE FOURTH ANNIVERSARY OF THE ACWM (M-L)

Boston (NANS DAULY) May 14 - On April 28, the National Executive of the American Communist Workers Movement (Marxist-Leninist) convened the FIRST MEETING of the Central Organizing Committee of the ACWM (M-L).

The initiation of the Central Organizing Committee brings to completion the first phase of the rectification of the ACWM (M-L ) (struggle against bureaucracy and anarchism, inside) which was launched in March 1971 and creates tremendous material conditions for carrying through to the end the task of BUILDING THE NATIONAL ORGANS OF WORKING CLASS PROPA-GANDA. 2 - DECISIONS OF THE CENTRAL ORGANIZING COMMITTEE OF THE AMERICAN COMMUNIST WORKERS MOVEMENT (MARXIST-LENINIST)

Boston (NANS DAILY) May 14 - The first meeting of the Central Organizing Committee of the American Communist Workers Movement (Marxist-Leninist) took several (continued on page 2) (continued from page 1) important decisions. Following is a summary of these decisions:

The Central Organizing Committee went deeply into the question of BUILDING THE NATIONAL ORGANS OF WORKING CLASS PROPAGANDA. The Central Organizing Committee affirmed that it is on this front, the front of revolutionary propaganda, that the organization must concentrate its attack on the dictatorship of the monopoly capitalist class over the American working class. very propaganda instrument in the U.S. speaks for the monopoly capitalist class and no propaganda instrument speaks for the working class. The proletariat must take as its FIRST DECISIVE TASK the thoroughgoing OPPOSITION TO and DESTRUCTION OF bourgeois attitude, outlook and propaganda and enunciation of proletarian attitude, outlook and propaganda on the national and all-embracing basis.

To carry out the task of BUILDING THE NATIONAL ORGANS OF WORKING CLASS PROPAGANDA it is absolutely essential that the ACWM (M-L) provide general political analysis on all questions facing the working and oppressed masses and to develop the active participation of the organization and the revolutionary masses in the political affairs of the country on the local and national basis. The over-all method for advancing this work was adopted: carry out thorough-going investigation and study deep amongst the working and oppressed masses guided by the works of Marx, Engels, Lenin, Stalin and Chairman Mao.

The Central Organizing Committee upheld the line that the WORKING CLASS IS THE LEAD-ING AND MAIN FORCE OF REVOLUTION. The Central Organizing Committee took several practical measures to direct revolutionary propaganda into the working class as a FIRST PRINCIPLE as well as to specifically develop the revolutionary politics in the working class.

The Central Organizing Committee was founded AT ONCE on the basis of class struggle against liquidationism, liberalism and bourgeois individualism and resolute and unswerving adherence to the MARXIST-LENIN-IST POLITICAL LINE. The Central Organizing Committee recognizes that such evils as liquidationism, liberalism and bourgeois individualism inside the organization are the reflection of the dogmatist and revisionist lines of the social-fascists (socialist in word, fascist in deed) outside. The Central Organizing Committee declared that THE CLASS STRUGGLE INSIDE IS ABSOLUTE.

The Central Organizing Committee firmly upheld the line of building basic communist units and communist committees at all levels in the organization and uncompromising opposed the line of building bourgeois co-ordination committees.

The Central Organizing Committee dealt in great detail with the question of unity amongst Marxist-Leninists in the U.S. The Central Organizing Committee calls upon all genuine Marxist-Leninist groups and individuals to UNITE ON THE BASIS OF THE MARXIST-LENINIST POLITICAL LINE. The Central Organizing Committee strongly holds that UNITY ON THE BASIS OF THE MARXIST-LENINIST POLITICAL LINE can only flourish through uncompromising class struggle against the concrete manifestations of dogmatism and revisionism inside the Marxist-Le:.inist ranks as well as outside.

The Central Organizing Committee calls upon all genuine Marxist-Leninist groups and and individuals to organize for and participate in the upcoming CONFERENCE OF NORTH AMERICAN MARXIST-LENINISTS.

The Central Organizing Committee highly values the contribution being made by the COMMUNIST PARTY OF CANADA (MARXIST-LENINIST) and its leader Comrade Hardial Bains in working for the unity of all genuine Marxist-Leninists in the U.S. and North America.

The Central Organizing Committee affirms the general line of persisting in DIVIDING THE FORCES to AROUSE THE MASSES and calls upon all local units to GO ALL OUT and develop their initiative in the basic campaigns to DENOUNCE, CRITICIZE AND REPUDIATE MONOPOLY CAPITALISM, study the works of MARX, ENGELS, LENIN, STALIN, and CHAIRMAN MAO in order to develop general political analysis and participation in political affairs and to build the organs of working class propaganda.

The Central Organizing Committee strengthened the democratic centralism of the organization and its national initiative by strengthening various REGIONAL COMMITTEES of the ACWM (ML) and by strengthening the NATIONAL SECRETARIAT.

The Central Organizing Committee unanimously elected its National Executive Committee with Comrade Tim Hall as National Secretary.

The Central Organizing Committee affirms that there is only one INTERNATIONAL COMMUNIST MOVEMENT led by the COM-

MUNIST PARTY OF CHINA and the ALBAN-IAN PARTY OF LABOUR.

The Central Organizing Committee affirms its close fraternal relations with the COM-MUNIST PARTY OF CANADA (MARXIST-LENINIST). The Central Organizing Committee considers the experience of the CPC (M-L) in rebuilding the first Party in North America on the basis of MAO TSETUNG THOUGHT as an invaluable contribution to the American working class. The Central Organizing Committee hails the tremendous success of the 22nd Congress of the CPC (M-L).

The Central Organizing Committee affirms the close fraternal relations existing between the ACWM (M-L) and the COMMUNIST PARTY OF IRELAND (MARXIST-LENINIST) and the COMMUNIST PARTY OF ENGLAND (MARXIST-LENINIST).

The Central Organizing Committee warmly hails the recent up urges in the ARMED AGRARIAN REVOLUTION in India led by the COMMUNIST PARTY OF INDIA (MARXIST-LENINIST) and the revolutionary authority of Comrade Charu Mazumdar.

The Central Organizing Committee resolutely denounces the Ghandi government, lackey of U.S. imperialism and Soviet social-imperialism, for its arch-reactionary murder of Comrade Charu Mazumdar, respected and beloved leader of the Indian Revolution, and for all its murderous crimes against the Indian people.

The Central Organizing Committee warmly hails the great victories won by the heroic people of Vietnam, under the leadership of the Provisional Revolutionary Government and the National Liberation Front of South Viet Nam and the Vietnamese Workers Party, in their sacred war against U.S. imperialism and for national salvation.

The Central Organizing Committee resolutely denounces U.S. imperialism for its flagrant violations of the Agreement on Ending the War and Restoring Peace in Vietnam, including the stationing of 20,000 "civilian advisors" in Vietnam, unprecendented arming of the fascist Thieu clique, continued mining of Vietnamese ports and harbors, instigation of their puppet Thieu to carry out armed attacks against the liberated zones, etc.

The Central Organizing Committee warmly hails the great victories won by the Laotian people, under the leadership of the Lao Patriotic Front, in their sacred war against II S imperialism and for national salvation. The Central Organizing Committee resolutely denounces U.S. imperialism for its monstrous disregard for the Peace treaty signed in Laos, for its barbarous bombings of liberated zones in Laos and for all its Nazi war acts and interference in Laos and throughout Indochina.

The Central Organizing Committee warmly hails the tremendous victories won by the Cambodian people, under the leadership of the National United Front of Cambodia with Samdech Sihanouk as head of state which has already liberated 90% of the territory and 80% of the population of Cambodia.

3 - NIXON'S NATIONAL ENERGY POLICY: MORE EXPLOITATION OF CANADIAN LAND AND LABOUR!

Boston (NANS DAILY) May 14 - People's Canada Daily News, vol. 2, no. 83, April 23, 1973 carried the following article, entitled: "Nixon's National Energy Policy: More Exploitation of Canadian Land and Labour! (excerpted)

On Wednesday, April 18, U.S. President Richard Nixon announced to the U.S. Congress his proposed national energy policy, much of which will have a direct effect on Canada and Canadian natural resources. When this policy is put into effect, it will mean the abolition of all U.S. tariffs and quotas on all the oil which Canada is capable of exporting to the United States. That would mean the import of 1,240,000 barrels of Canadian oil a day into the U.S. without any tariff. Everything above that level would have an import fee placed on it and the import fee would gradually (by 1980) be extended to cover all imports of Canadian d.t. This policy is to begin on May 1. The import fee, which would be higher than the present tariff rate, is not something the U.S. wants, but it must have such a fee in order to protect domestic oil production until the U.S. can work out a long-term oil agreement with Canada: that is until such a time as the U.S. can impose an unequal oil treaty on Canada. Statements of the President's advisors left no doubt that such a treaty is just what the U.S. imperialists are angling for. On the one hand, they wish to protect domestic oil production and on the other hand are most eager to get their hands on Canadian oil at the cheapest possible rate. If the U.S. can work out an energy policy with Canada, it will then drop the import fee on Canadian oil.

The U.S. government is anxious for export of Canadian oil to the U.S. to increase substantially, while the Canadian Government, faced with certain internal contradictions, is attempting to hold back temporarily the flow of oil and natural gas to the U.S. The U.S. Government is particularly anxious to assure itself of a constant source of oil, even if political developments should cut the supply of

fuel from the Middle East. Canada, being completely dominated by the U.S. imperialists, is the ideal place to look. Therefore, the U.S. Government has let it be known that substantial increases in import of Canadian oil are to be tied up with a continental oil security agreement, which means security for the U.S. imperialists as they become more and more isolated from the peoples of the world. The continental oil security policy simply means that if the foreign supply of oil to the U.S. should be cut off, Canada will be obliged to continue supplying the U.S. imperialists with oil whatever the domestic requirements of Canada are and whatever the internal political situation is.

This two-sided U.S. oil policy is bound to exacerbate the contradictions in Canada between different sections of the monopoly capitalist class. In March, the Trudeau Government announced that it was going to place limits on the amount of oil which could be exported to the U.S. . . . This move by the national government evoked howls of rage and anger from Alberta, the oil-producing province, which said that the right of the province's private property was being infringed upon by the federal government. The Alberta government was in a struggle with the federal government over who is going to control the natural resources - and eventually the revenues from these natural resources the provincial or the national governments. Thus, Trudeau's move to limit the export of Canadian (primarily Albertan) oil had nothing whatsoever to do with "nationalism" or "anti-imperialism", but was simply another manoeuvre on the part of the federal government to consolidate its control over the nation's natural resources and the wealth generated by selling them to the foreign im-End Item. perialists.
