Coming out of the mass movements against the U.S. monopoly capitalist class, the Association of Communist Workers was formed for the purpose of building a genuine Communist Party in the U.S.A. Our experience has been that without a party based on Marxism-Leninism Mao Tsetung Thought our revolutionary struggles could not be sustained for long or carried to a higher level and were being liquidated one by one.

By daring to take into our own hands the historic task of building anew the genuine Communist Party, by daring to bring Mao Tsetung Thought before the broadest sections of the masses, by daring to unite on the basis of political line and to uphold class struggle as the basis of moving forward, and by daring to uphold our knowledge gained through revolutionary practice as being true, we have solved a few problems of building the local communist unit among the masses and have contributed to uniting the Marxist-Leninists around the country.

Through consultation and common practice with the ACWM (M-L), we have found that our experience is in essence the same, and have found that we are agreed that the most important task today in building the party and advancing the proletarian revolution is to BUILD THE INSTRUMENTS OF WORKING CLASS PROPAGANDA in the MIDST OF THE REVOLUTIONARY MOVEMENT.

We are very proud to be joining with the ACWM (M-L) on this basis and we are enthusiastic about taking the step forward to come under the leadership of the Central Organizing Committee of the ACWM (M-L) in building the NATIONAL ORGANS OF WORKING CLASS PROPA-

GANDA. With this step we are quite confident that the day is not far off when the American working class will have its own party and with the leadership of the party the working class will achieve its deepest aspirations to overthrow the monopoly capitalist class, to establish the dictatorship of the proletariat, and to build a bright red socialist U.S.A.

Boston (NANS DAILY) July 26, 1973 -On July 16 and 17 the American Revolutionary Youth Propaganda Team of the Northeast Committee of ACWM (M-L) carried the campaign to support the Conference of North American Marxist-Leninists into the Philadelphia area. Uniting closely with the comrades and friends of the local unit of ACWM (M-L) and the Philadelphia Area Committee to Support the Conference of North American Marxist-Leninists, the ARY Propaganda Team organized meetings and discussions and carried out widescale propaganda work around the basic line of building the Marxist-Leninist Communist Party as the decisive factor and organizing the Conference of North American Marxist-Leninists which is the concrete step being taken by the genuine Marxist-Leninists in the U.S. to unite together in one center and lay firm foundations for building the Party. The speech generated a great deal of discussion amongst the comrades and friends present and united the entire meeting in support of the North American Conference of Marxist-Leninists to be held in Buffalo, N.Y., August 18 to September

Earlier in the day the ARY Propaganda Team had carried out a mass democracy meeting at Temple University in which several interested students participated. During the mass democracy several students actively took up the question of building the Party and the ARY comrades engaged them in discussion for a long period in order to clarify to the maximum the various questions raised.

The entire propaganda campaign led by the ARY team in Philadelphia strengthened two basic trends: 1. the emerging unity in Philadelphia between the ACWM (M-L) and other Marxist-Leninist groups and individuals and the growth of more and more discussion and consultation on basic political questions amongst the genuinely progressive groups and 2. the active participation of class-conscious workers in supporting the ACWM (M-L) and building the Marxist-Leninist movement in Philadelphia. 167 - MESSAGE TO THE CHICAGO WORKING CLASS
Boston (NANS DAILY) July 26, 1973 Chicago Worker, Produced by the Chicago Unit
of the ACWM (M-L), no. 3, July 10, 1973,
announced the GRAND OPENING of the William
Z. Foster Workers Center Monday July 23,
and carried an article entitled "Message to
the Chicago Working Class:" the full text of
which is reproduced below.

We are producing this leaflet to call your attention to the opening of the William Z. Foster Center, and we would like you to read it seriously in light of your own experience under the capitalist system of wage slavery. It is to be a workers' school and club, with the basic principle of educating workers politically and strengthening class solidarity. The dissemination of the works of Marx, Engels, Lenin, Stalin and Chairman Mao is an

important part of this task. The William Z. Foster Center is a new development in Chicago, and we urge you to participate in its program.

The William Z. Foster Center, under the leadership of the American Communist Workers Movement (Marxist-Leninist), will be run by workers, for their own class. There will be a library and reading room, and revolutionare literature will be available. Regular meetings will be held to organize workers on the problems created by the capitalist class. It is very important at this time that workers take up the study of political economy in the light of works of Marx and Lenin, because it is on the questions of inflation, soaring prices, decreasing wages, exorbitant rents, welfare, housing shortage, unemployment, etc., that the capitalists spread maximum mystification, and that workers require the answers to. There are also the questions of growing fascism, which the capitalists are bringingabout because the development of the general crisis of capitalism, and the intensification of the contradiction between capital and labor. Also, the question of imperialism and war must be sorted out among the working class, to oppose the reactionary chauvinism of the capitalist war mongers.

Does this mean that we are calling on working people to engage in self-cultivation, to take part in meetings exposing the capitalists just to be able to describe the situation? Not at all. The only reason for exposing what the capitalist money bags are up to is to arouse our class politically, to clarify the fact that all these problems are caused by the capitalist system and nothing else, and that they can be solved only by overthrowing the capitalist class and establishing the working class as ruling class. The program of the William Z. Foster Center must serve this point.

We are building this center among the working people of Chicago because the working class does not have its own political center, and because the workers are consciously kept out of the political affairs of the country. This is the doing of the capitalist class, which will politically mobilize the working class for one purpose only -- to do the dirty work of the filthy rich capitalists, whether it is to fight in imperialist wars of aggression, so the capitalists can enrich themselves on the plunder and robbery of other peoples; or to vote for one or another capitalist candidate who will invariably uphold the further exploitation of the working class and continue the system of soaring prices, decreasing wages, spiraling inflation, exorbitant rents, etc. To mobilize workers in the class interests of the capitalists is the scheme of the parasitic ruling class.

We must oppose this scheme of the capitalists, and mobilize the workers in their own class interests. As the first step in doing this we need our own class newspapers and political centers.

Our class brothers and sisters have waged heroic struggles throughout their history. Why is it, then, that a tiny handful of rich parasites continue to live off the labor of the vast majority of the popula-

tion when it is obvious that revolutionary spirit is present in the working class? This is why: the capitalist class holds political power, and has its own organized political parties and government, while our class still has little to say about the political affairs of the country. We do not have our own revolutionary communist party, with its own clear cut political program and manifesto, pointing out the path in the overall struggle against the capitalist system, and abolition of wage slavery through social revolution.

The opening of the William Z. Foster
Center is a step in the right direction for
rectifying this situation, because it is the
dissemination of revolutionary ideas among
the workers which will conditions for the
building of a Marxist-Leninist Communist
Party. For the first time in a long while,
the Chicago working class will be able to
discuss political views representing its
class interests, develop analysis based on
Marxism-Leninism-Mao Tsetung Thought, and
hold regular meetings in direct opposition
to the politics of the capitalists.

168 - SOVIET LEADER BREZHNEV ACCUSES D.R.V.N. OF "AGGRESSION"

Boston (NANS DAILY) July 26 - People's Canada Daily News, July 14, 1973, carried the following article.

The chieftain of Soviet social imperialism, Leonid Brezhnev, on July 10 accused the Democratic Republic of Viet Nam of "aggression" against U.S. imperialism. an official luncheon in Moscow in the presence of Premier Pham Van Dong and First Secretary Le Duan of the D.R.V.N., social imperialist Brezhnev made very clear that he has gone over to the side of the imperialists and fully supports the U.S. imperialists' "theory" of "aggression from the North" and the concoction that "both sides are responsible" for the war in Viet Nam. In his speech he said that there must be "complete and strict fulfullment" of the Paris Agreement "by all sides...is precisely what is meant by the signature of the Soviet Union". Mr. Brezhnev made absolutely no mention of the U.S. imperialist aggression in Viet Nam nor did he denounce the manoevres of the Saigon administration to undermine the Agreement. According to the Associated Press report, "his declaration was clearly directed as much at North Viet Nam as at South Viet Nam and the United States".

This is a very clear self-exposure by the Soviet social imperialists. More than ever before it is clear what the purpose of Brezhnev's U.S. visit actually was last month.

Brezhnev became so "close" (politically) to Richard Nixon, that he is actually doing the bidding of the U.S. imperialists. Brezhnev and his clique of traitors are so desperate to "normalize" relations with the United States, so anxious to settle once and for all their respective spheres of influence, that he will do anything to put out the flames of people's war and the struggles for national liberation.

Since January 27, 1973, the date of the signing of the Paris Agreement on Viet Nam, the U.S. imperialists and the Saigon puppet administration have violated almost every paragraph of the Agreement and its protocols. The imperialists have carried on their war of aggression in the south. They have sent planes over the D.R.V.N. and P.R.G.-S.V.N. territory to spy. They have refused to release thousands of political prisoners and have spirited away many thousands more so they cannot even be traced. They have instituted the most brutal and fascist repression of everyone who stands for the establishment of a peaceful, neutral, democratic and independent Viet Nam. They have broken their agreements with the D.R.V.N. And above all the imperialists have carried out the most savage and brutal bombing of the liberated areas of Cambodia in order to hold up the revolutionary war in that country. During the whole time while the imperialists and their lackeys have been carrying out this wanton aggression and these violations of the Paris Agreement and the Joint Communique of June 13, 1973, the same imperialists have been sending out a steady stream of lies to the effect that the D.R.V.N. and the P.R.G. are responsible for violations. This is done simply to cover up their own criminal responsibility as the aggressors and the cause of the war in Viet Nam.

And now Soviet social imperialist chieftain Brezhnev, the "close ally" (his own words) of Richard Nixon, is taking up the same theme, namely that "both sides" are responsible for the U.S. imperialist war of aggression against Viet Nam. It is not an accident that in a speech on Viet Nam which is described by the press as "lengthy" there is no mention whatsoever of the aggression by U.S. imperialism against the people of Viet Nam. It is not accidental because it is part and parcel of the plot worked out by Brezhnev and Nixon since Nixon's May 1972 visit to the Soviet Union to divide up the world into imperialist spheres of influence. The two superpowers are colluding and contending for world hegemony. Wars of national liberation and revolutionary wars in general threaten to upset the status quo of the spheres of influence established by the imperialist powers. For this reason the Soviet Union wants to have "peace" in Viet Nam.

The two superpowers have "agreed" to divide Viet Nam in two halves, the upper half which the Soviet Union hopes to make into its neo-colony and the lower half which the U.S. imperialists hope to make into their neo-colony. That is why the Soviet Union is denouncing the D.R.V.N. -the social imperialists do not want the war of national liberation waged by the South Vietnamese people to be carried through to the end. They would gladly see the permanent partition of Viet Nam into two halves, each controlled by one superpower. Thus the resistance of the Vietnamese people, the National Front for Liberation and the Provisional Revolutionary. Government to the attacks by the Saigon

puppets are repugnant to the social imperialists like Brezhnev. They want to liquidate this resistance, liquidate the revolution and establish their neo-colonies on the backs of the Vietnamese people.

This plot by the Soviet social imperialists, in collusion with the U.S. imperialists will never work. The entire Vietnamese people, led by the Viet Nam Workers' Party in the north and by the National Front for Liberation in the south have been struggling for decades to achieve their complete emancipation from the bonds of colonialism, neocolonialism and imperialism. They will never surrender their victories on the orders of such as Brezhnev, the "ally" of U.S. imperialism. They will carry their revolution through to the end.

On July 4, Gambian President Dawda Jawara received in Banjul the Government Delegation of the Royal Government of National Union of Cambodia headed by Chan Youran, Cambodian Minister of Popular Education and Youth and Special Envoy of the Cambodian Head of State. During the reception, Chan Youran handed to the Gambian President a private letter from Samdech Sihanouk. End Item.

170 - PARIS AGREEMENT VIOLATIONS CONDEMNED

A spokesman of the Foreign Ministry of the Royal Government of National Union of Cambodia issued a statement on June 30 in which he condemned the many violations of the Paris Agreement on ending the war and restoring peace in Viet Nam and of the June 13 Joint Communique by the U.S. imperialists and the Saigon administration.

The Statement points out that since June 13 the U.S. imperialists have not changed their policy in Viet Nam one iota. The imperialists and their puppets of the Saigon regime continue their attacks on the liberated areas under the control of the Provisional Revolutionary Government. The statement said: "These acts demonstrate that the U.S. and Saigon administration have gravely violated the Paris Agreements on Viet Nam and the Joint Communique of June 13, 1973."

The statement continued that the RGNUC fully supported the six-point proposal put forth on June 28 by the P.R.G. for the sett-lement of the problem in South Viet Nam....
