U.S. IMPERIALIST PLOT UNCOVERED!

REVISIONISTS LINKED WITH C.I.A.!

During the past two weeks the PEOPLE'S VOICE has uncovered a federal government plan to buy up informers in the Watts area and other working class districts of Los Angeles for the purpose of gathering information which could then be used against the people of these areas. Essentially, the plan is designed to buy off the dissatisfied people in the working class districts while gathering up the information which the government' would need in order to further enslave the already oppressed people of South Los Angeles.

This plot against the people takes the form of a semi-secret "study" financed by the federal government and administered by the "Institute of Government and Public Affairs" at UCLA. Before the August uprising was even over the federal government had appropriated \$50,000 for the purpose of "studying" the uprising. In the time since the uprising the amount allotted to this "study" has been increased by the federal government to \$200,000. This money supposedly is coming from the Commerce Department, but the F.B.I. and the C.I.A. would benefit from the information gathered much more than would the Commerce Department.

The formal purpose of the money is to hire thirty "interviewers" for the purpose of discovering the "causes and effects of the Watts riots including the attitudes and organizations in the community both before, during, and after the riots."


The number of "interviews" to be conducted is 2700 with the great majority of the "interviews" in the working class districts where more "trouble" may break out again. Those who are being hired and paid off with the \$200,000 are largely those who have been identified with "civil rights" and "radical" organizations. The information from the "study" is to be the exclusive property of the federal government and the federal government will do whatever it wishes with the "study" while revealing only what it wishes to

On the surface the "study" seems legitimate and benign, but when some essential questions

are posed some interesting answers and relationships appear and the real nature of the "study" is revealed.

The questions which must be asked are: Why is the federal government interested in spending so much money in order to secure basic information about the working class districts and the people in those districts? Why was the federal government not so interested in gathering up such information before the uprising? Why is it that the same imperialist federal government which pays off thousands of National Guard and Army troops to suppress the people in Los Angoles, New York, Rochester,

PROBLEMS OF STRATEGY IN GUERRILLA WAR AGAINST JAPAN

Monday, Sept. 20 1965

May, 1938

(We are reprinting this book by Mao Tse-tung in weekly installments. This is the first such installment.)

CHAPTER I Why Raise the Question of Strategy in Guerrilla War?

In the War of Resistance Against Japan, regular warfare is primary and guerrilla warfare supplementary. This point has already been correctly settled. Thus, it seems there are only tactical problems in guerrilla warfare. Why then raise the question of strategy?

If China were a small country in which the role of guerrilla warfare was only to render direct support over short distances to the campaigns of the regular army, there would, of course, be only tactical problems but no strategic ones. On the other hand, if China were a country as strong as the Soviet Union and the invading enemy could either be quickly expelled, or, even though his expulsion were to take some time, he could not occupy extensive areas, then again guerrilla warfare would simply play a supporting role in campaigns, and

Representatives of the American working class met the weekend of Sept. 4-5, 1965 in Los Angeles at the Founding Conference to reconstitute the COMMUNIST PARTY U.S.A. (MARXIST-LENINIST). The groups represented were the Provisional Organizing Committee to Reconstitute the Marxist-Leninist Communist Party in the U.S.A. and the Workers' Organizing Committee (Marxist-Leninist).

The Founding Conference made preparations for a Party program, a Party constitution, a public Party declaration (to be issued shortly), and for the first National Party Congress to be convened within a year. The Founding Conference elected a Central Committee, and decided to issue two Party organs-The RED FLAG, the theoretical organ of the Central Committee, and the PEOPLE'S VOICE, the semi-official agitational organ of the Party. The reconstituted Party is to be known as the COMMUNIST PARTY U.S.A. (MARXIST-LEN-INIST).

Cambridge, Natchez and thousands of other locations both here and abroad is now so interested in gathering information about the people it oppresses in Los Angeles? Is it possible that the same imperialist government which has been responsible for inhuman conditions of life in Los Angeles and other areas of the world will use the information it gathers for other than oppressive ends? Why is the government paying off people in "civil rights" and "radical" organizations to gather up the needed information?

ANSWERS TO ESSENTIAL QUESTIONS REVEAL TRUE NATURE OF "STUDY"

Once these questions are examined thoroughly the answers become clear:

The federal government is interested in spending \$200,000 on this "study" at this time because it needs the information which will be gathered in order to suppress the already oppressed people in ways more subtle, sophisticated and less costly than sending in thousands of fully armed combat troops. With the relatively small sum of \$200,000 the federal government will be able to buy up the information it needs in order to discover and smash the patriotic efforts of freedom-seeking people including the smashing of self-defense liberation units organized and organizing in the area. In order to continue to suppress the people without spending millions of dollars in putting down armed uprisings, the government must have information on where to strike most effectively and subtly in the working class districts before effective collective action can be initiated by the people. This is why \$200,000 is being spent by the federal government to secure basic information about the working class districts in Los Angeles and about the people in those districts.

It is only now, after the heroic August uprising, that the federal government feels threatened. Before the uprising the government felt it had the people "in their place" and that it could continue to step on the people and rob them while not a sound of dissent was uttered. Only after the people arose collectively to fight off the common enemy did the federal government feel it was worth while to spend \$200,000 on finding out what the people are doing on behalf of their own liberation. That is why the government was not interested in such a study before the uprising.

It is evident that the imperialist U.S. government, which has been responsible for the oppression of millions around the world including the entire Negro nation in the South is not very interested in changing things in any meaingful way, for to do so would threaten the position of ruthless superiority U.S. imperialism attempts to maintain in the world. If the rulers of the U.S. government wished to change anything they would not need to undertake an eleaborate information-gathering study, for, as the designers and builders of this house of oppression and exploitation, they already know in great detail what is wrong and what needs changing, But to change anything which would alleviate the people's oppression would ruin the position of power which the parasitical ruling class in the U.S. attempts desperately to hang on to. That is why it is idealistic and uninformed foolishness to think that the information which this "study" gathers for the imperialist U.S. government is going to be used by that government for anything other than oppressive ends.

REVISIONISTS AND TROTSKYITES UNMASKED AS PAID AGENTS OF U.S. IMPERIALISM

An important aspect of this "study" is that many of the 30 "interviewers" who are being paid off with the \$200,000 to secure the needed information are with groups which like to put up phony facades of "radicalism"—groups such as the revisionist-C.P.U.S.A., W.E.B. DuBois

clubs, CORE, SNCC, the Trotskyite S.W.P. and Y.S.A. People such as Jimmy Garrett of SNCC, Ronald Ridenour of the revisionist-C.P.U.S.A. and of its stillborn baby the DuBois clubs, Jon Travasti of CORE, and a host of other opportunists are busy as "interviewers" gathering information for the criminal U.S. government at \$2.25 an hour.

To these individuals the desire for money outweighs all other considerations. As Ronald Ridenour of the revisionist-C.P.-U.S.A. said, after contemplating his wage, "The study itself isn't any terrible thing." The money these "radicals" receive is being paid by the same government that paid 15,000 National Guardsmen to suppress the people of Los Angeles, for the federal government recognizes that the function of these "interviewer" jobs serves the same purpose as the jobs of National Guardsmen: that, is, to help further enslave the people.

Operating from the very start on the assumption that the August uprising was a "riot" rather than a spontaneous uprising of the most oppressed elements of the United States working class, the "study" reveals itself as nothing more than a facade to gather up counter-revolutionary information for U.S. imperialism. The reason the federal government has enlisted the aid of "civil rights radicals" in such an endeavor is because the federal government believes it can buy off dissatisfaction in the working class districts by buying off these people and groups, while at the same time buying up much needed information. Unfortunately for U.S. imperialism, however, not much dissatisfaction will be drained off and not much information will be discovered by utilizing this benign "Left," for this petty-bourgeois, campusoriented "Left" has about as much rapport with the working people of Los Angeles as has John McCone of the C.I.A.

These groups and these individuals which are once again prostituting themselves have long served the interests of U.S. imperialism, and their relationship now as directly paid agents of U.S. imperialism once again con-

firms to the working people the true traitorous nature of these groups and individuals as slaves of the ruling class in the United States. This new, blatant chapter in the revisionist and Trotskyite history of betraying the working class indicates that the revisionist-C.P.U.S.A., W.-E.B. DuBois clubs, P.L.P., Trotskyite S.W.P. and Y.S.A., SN-CC, CORE, S.D.S., are all enemies of the working class serving on behalf of U.S. imperialism to drain off, inform on, and becloud the finest efforts of the United States working class. The finest efforts or intentions of any of the separate individuals participating in this "study" are overwhelmed by and lost in the usual revisionist and Trotskyite counter-revolutionary consequences, because the federal government's imperialist voice is calling the tune to every step of this phony "study."

The purpose of this article is not only to expose the true nature of this secret "study" and the individuals involved with it, but most important to warn the working people of Los Angeles, especially the people of Watts, to be on the lookout for agents of this "study" and not to cooperate with the "study" in any way, shape or form. Every bit of information which is gathered from the working class areas is going to be used by the federal government against the people of those areas. This fact is as certain as the fact that every one of the National Guardsmen used against the people of the working class districts is employed by the U.S. government. To coperate with this "study" or with any individuals involved with it is to tighten even further an already tight noose.
