In February 1966 we asked Mr. Sealey and another comrade to jointly lead a discussion on 6.3.66 on "BARBADOS and the EASTERN CARIBBEAN" which he agreed to do but asked us to bill him as Convenor, Caribbean Committee C.P.G.B. On 25th February 1966 we sent him a letter expressing the opinion of C.W.M. E.C. members' "that we want Cde. Sealey our Caribbean brother to speak to us NOT Cde. Sealey as a representative of the C.P.G.B."..." we are requesting the C.P.G.B. to supply a speaker – if we had done this, then we would have said Cde so and so of the C.P.G.B."

Mr Sealey replied on 1.3.66 stating "...I noted that in your Caribbean Workers' Weekly following a meeting held on 7.2.66 at New Ambassador Hotel, under the auspices of the Caribbean Advisory Committee and the London district of the C.P.G.B.; whereas Dr. Jagan and myself along with Cde. Woddis spoke, criticism of Dr. Jagan and the C.P.G.B. as a whole; was made by your organisation. In view of the aforementioned action, plus your committee's refusal of my request, I am using this medium to decline your invitation to address your (C.W.M.) meeting on Sunday 6th march 1966."

For the time being we are leaving this matter here, but early in May 1966 we are publishing a 12 paged pamphlet exposing the renegades from Marxism/Leninism in King Street, including our unfortunate brother Sealey and his friends including Bill "Caliban" Strachan.

This pamphlet "THE RENEGADES FROM MARXISM/LENINISM" is intended to expose the hypocritical role of the C.P.G.B. and the stooges from the Commonwealth and Colonies who help them in their "revisionist dirty work."
