We currently have 5100 domestic subscriptions to The Militant. This represents an increase of 1810 subs since the September Party convention. Of these 5100 domestic subs, 1162 or 22.8% are in states where there is no party branch.

Our domestic bundles have increased more than 1600 since last August.

Bundles ordered by 55 YSA locals and areas where we have YSA at-large members presently total 1829 out of the 5460 in domestic bundles or 34.5% of the total domestic bundles. At the plenum last Feb. 32 YSA locals and at-large areas ordered 1004 out of the 3453 bundle copies or 29% of the total bundles.

The renewal rate for Militant subscriptions has remained about the same as it was at the last convention. Over one third of the long term subs are renewed. Renewals are still coming in for subs sold during the Fall sub drive. We expect the renewal rate for these 3 month subscriptions to be at least 10%.
