The Klan appeared in front of the Houston SWP branch headquarters with robes and rifles following favorable editorials in the morning daily papers on the Starsky case. They dispersed before cops arrived. In Boston swastikas were painted on the SWP headquarters door. There have been threats from self-proclaimed Nazis in Minneapolis and from "anonymous citizens" in Portland.
