TO ALL ORGANIZERS AND BOSTON WORK DIRECTORS

Dear Comrades,

Those who attempted to disrupt the National Student Conference Against Racism were led by a grouping from Brooklyn College, the Committee for Justice, in which a group called the Puerto Rican Revolutionary Workers Organization is dominant. Some militants were disoriented by the disruption attempt, and in some areas, we have found that red-baiting charges leveled at the YSA and SWP by this group and others at the conference have had some effect on independents we have been working with. The best way this redbaiting attack on the NSCAR will be countered is through building the May 17 action, reaching out to involve Black youth in every aspect of NSCAR activity and in building the local citywide May 17 coalitions.

The attached article from the Brooklyn College student newspaper, Kingsman, was written by The Committee for Justice. might be useful to show to certain individuals disoriented by the red-baiting, because it exposes the real nature of the attack leveled against the conference by this group. Among other things, the article shows that this group planned its disruption in advance of the conference; that it planned this disruption because it disagreed with the political line of "stop racist attacks on children, and keep the buses rolling, no matter what. calling in of the National Guard to protect the children was seen as an acceptable method of achieving forced integration." They state that their position is that "forced busing to achieve integration is a violation of people's right to self-determination." Even their position on community control they label as "nonrealistic." They define "community control" to include white control of schools in the white community. They make it clear that they are opposed to the May 17 march and counterpose "community organizing" to it. They attack the NAACP.

Thus, this article can be utilized to demonstrate that the red-baiting against the SWP and YSA is in reality a cover for an attack on May 17 and the whole fight to desegregate the schools.




