TO ALL AT-LARGE MEMBERS

Dear Comrades,

The spring national fund drive begins today. Already \$1,363 has been received by the National Office. These early payments by 15 locals and eight at-large areas amount to four percent of the \$38,000 national goal to be achieved during the next 16 weeks. Every indication is that the fund drive is off to a very good start.

The \$50 contributed to the drive by at-large areas accounts for five percent of the at-large goal of \$1,000. Several at-large members have also sent in payment schedules. One at-large member, for example, has pledged \$40 to the fund drive, to be paid in four installments.

Attached is a scoreboard listing the quotas of each local. Beginning next Wednesday, the National Office will regularly compile and send out a scoreboard listing each local and at-large area, its quota, the total amount and percent of its goal paid to date, and where the national fund drive should be each week of the drive. In order for the fund drive to be on schedule, by next Wednesday, the National Office should have received a total of \$2,972, or seven percent of the \$38,000 goal.
