Dear Jim,

Since you left we held one common meeting with the League's leadership in which we discussed the political situation in the ME, the documents that will be presented to the convention and how they will be written. There was a cordial atmosphere, we agreed on the general political lines and on the kind of documents we want.

In addition there were two informal meetings between Mikado and me.

Moreover; a. It was decided to issue a common leaflet concerning Camp David which will be distributed in the Arab villages, starting this Saturday.

b. A common editorial meeting will be held this week in order to discuss the issuing of the next "Matzpen incorporating Spark".

c. The League's next "International" will open with a common editorial. We'll also contribute an article.

d. We'll issue a common leaflet directed to youth.

e. A common forum will be held in Jerusalem, starting this week.

f. The draft resolution on the M.E. is almost finished. It will be discussed in a common C.C. meeting, scheduled for Nov. the 25th.

g. The International political situation document is in the final stages of translation.

h. It was agreed on a common internal bulletin.

i: We agreed to leave tactical questions to a later stage of the unification process and to discuss them in an already common frame.

Our decision concerning the unification was accepted enthusiastically among our ranks. I don't know as yet how it was accepted among the League's members.

In meetings held so far, we haven't discussed party building. From the few talks I had with Mikado I gather that a lot of work will have to be dedicated to this matter.

We estimate that everything should be done to hasten the unification process. The task facing us today is working together as much as possible and getting to know the League's members.

It seems to me that contacts between their members and ours can clarify the foundations on which the unification stands and which problems will have to be tackled. I estimate that the common convention will be held in the end of January.

Chers camarades,

Nous avons enfin la possibilité de vous annoncer que quelques pas substantiels ont été faits ces derniers temps vers la fusion entre nos organisations. Après une longue période où les rapports ont de fait cessé, ceux-ci ont repris et il semble que, cette fois, la fusion est une possibilité réelle, voire relativement proche.

Un accord a pu être obtenu le dernier week-end, établissant les grandes lignes d'une fusion progressive de nos organisations : dès à présent nos organismes de direction entreprennent de fusionner une grande partie de leurs activités, et d'ici quelques semaines nous espérons faire de même pour nos sections locales et nos secteurs d'intervention.

Nos deux organisations ont décidé de repousser leurs congrès respectifs afin de permettre de débattre en commun les divers documents qui pourraient servir de base politique à la fusion.

Tout en étant conscients que de nombreux problèmes peuvent encore surgir dans le cadre de la fusion, nous sommes résolument optimistes quant aux possibilités de fusion rapide, qui comme vous le comprenez facilement, changerait substantiellement les conditions de notre activité politique.

Nous tenons à souligner le rôle important que le Sec. Un., et en particulier le camarade Dunder ont joué afin de permettre cette fusion et de déblayer le terrain de considérants secondaires. C'est bien ainsi que nous avons toujours considéré le rôle d'une direction internationale sachant user de son autorité pour aider les sections à surmonter certains problèmes auxquels elles peuvent se trouver confrontées.

Nous vous tiendrons évidemment informés des développements ultérieurs.
