SOCIALIST CHALLENGE SALES DRIVE

Comrades will know that we are launching a sales drive for Socialist Challenge to trysto push up the branch paid sales from around 3,500 to 5,000. This is a considerab le projected increase, but is necessitated by the precarious financial situation of the paper. Comrades should be under no illusions. We have run out of sources for subsidising the paper in the way we have done in the past. Unless we acheive this increase in sales, then at the very least the size of the paper will have to go down; at worst drastic cuts in the rest of the organisation,s expenditure will have to take place in order to maintain a weekly paper. This will threaten all our other publications and political projects.

We believe that in this period of rising class struggle, 5000 paid slaes is a realistic and acheivable figure. Some of the branch sales are at the moment extraordinarily low. Therefore we are asking all branch leaderships to take this as an item at their next meeting to discuss; a) are you still carrying out street sales - we know some branches have dropped them, and valuable sales are being lost b) do you do any pub sales - most areas have either lefty pubs or black/Irish pubs where they can sell c) do you allocate a number of papers to each member to sell; does every member sell the paper once a week as a norm d) do you have a sales committee or a regular review of sales on your branch committee. e) do you sell on your local campuses. We have around a month - to turn the situation around. Branch leaderships must act now.

Cdes will have noticed the revival of the S/C svents column in last weeks paper. We would like every branch to send in details of their public activities over the next few months as soon as possible to the paper. NATIONAL CUTS DEMONSTRATION/LOBBY

WEDNESDAY 28th NOVEMBER

Comrades should be getting all their Anti-Cuts Committees, Trades Councils. JSSCs etc. supporting this call by the Labour Party with action in the localities and delegations on the day. All London comrades should be also building for the march and lobby called by Lambeth Council for Wednesday 7th Nov. These two demos are important for beginning to centralise the widespread anti-cuts resistance building up, and also building the best balance of forces against the bureaucracy to make the TUC.s projected day of action in the New Year into a one-day national public sector strike leading to all-out indefinite strike action later next year against the cuts. Lambeth demo: assemble 12 noon, Clapham Common.

NATIONAL ANTI-RACIST DEMO - SUNDAY NOVEMBER 25th

This demonstration is sponsored by all the major black organisations — the IWAs, West Indian, Pakistani, Bangladeshi organisations etc —as well as the ANL, TUC, CP, SWP, IMG, CAIL and other anti-racist organisations. The organising conference held ten days ago was very representative—over 200 delegates—and the demo locks set to be 10,000 or more. This will be the second major national political focus against the Tory offensive, following on the heels of the successful abortion demonstration. This is a mational mobilisation for the IMG. We should be actively involved in establishing local ad-hoc committees to build for the demonstration, involving black, labour movement, womens and anti-racist ergs. We should argue for them to have an on-going character to argue for the three demands of the organisation—"No to the Tory Nationality Law"/No to the Tory Immigration Proposals/ Repeal the 1971 immigration act.
