BRITISH FYLAND: The Leyland dispute over the sacking of Derek Robinson is likely to be bitter and could well be prolonged. Edwards and the BL management would not have made such a provocative move without some collaboration with the Tory Government.

Given the rotten leadership in BL, this dispute will need solidarity action from other sectors of the class. This is not just an attack on BL but an attack on the entire working class. A defeat for BL will demoralise the militant vanguard and will tremendously strengthen the right wing. It will be a major factor in whether the working class can defend itself against the Tory attacks, let alone whether it will be able to go on the offensive.

Meanwhile Leyland supporters of the IMG with supporters of the WSL have launched a "Leyland Action Committee" to push forward the fight for a class struggle leadership. This committee has been met with the friendly reception from the striking BL workers in the midlands. Two professionally produced leaflets have been distributed and a successful meeting of BL workers held in Birmingham.

It is this national signficance and importance of this dispute which makes it essential for every IMG branch to discuss what its members can do.

*In those branches where BL plants exist cdes should make preparations to hold a meeting to which Layland Action Committee speakers are invited. Cdes should decide on the appropriate form of the meeting according to local circumstances (Trades Council meeting, or united front meeting, SC meeting, etc.)

*In every branch, cdes should be fighting for solidarity by putting motions through their trade union branch, students union, and through petitions, etc.

*In the T&GWU and the AUEW, we should be prepared to move resolutions to demand the union leadership make the strike official if this remains necessary after the TU executive meetings. EVERYWHERE we should ask for financial assistance. In those places where the political situation is favourable, we should ask for finances to be sent to the Action Committee also.

THE TURN AND THE NATIONAL CENTRE: A number of comrades have left or are leaving the centre this week to go into industry (or on courses to prepare for jobs). Last week cde Manzano left the centre; this week cde Dennis leaves. Cde Hutton will be leaving in a fortnight as will comrade Last. Cde Banner and Hill will be leaving at the latest by the end of next month. All of these moves will dispupt the work of the Centre, but we hope comrades will understand in light of the long-term benefits!

SOCIALIST CHALLENGE SALES PRIVE: The SC sales drive is making slow but definite progress. Sales through the branches last week just topped 4,000. Together with sales through bookshops, subs., etc. orders are verging on the 5,000 mark. This is good progress, but we still have a long way to go. Many branches are meeting their targets, but in order to get 5,000 branches sales we need some of the stronger ones to be going over 100 % mark of their target. Only this way will the weekly £450 subsidy from the IMG to SC be halted.

The following branches in particular are way below their targets: Cardiff, Idinburgh, Hull, Newcastle, Nottingham, Reading and many of the London branches. Cdes can see from the graph in last week's paper how they are doing. To overcome this lag, we are asking the London branches in particular to make a big effort in the coming weeks through institutionalising sales outside tubes, which have proved highly successful. We also need the branches with Leyland plants to continue the good work they have been doing with factory gate sales.

THIS WEEK'S ISSUE prirorities the cuts campaign and the Leyland struggle. London have ordered 1,000 copies for the cuts lobby on Wed. Extra copies for your branch should be phoned through to Mike Last at the Centre.

NATIONAL BRANCH ORGANISERS MEETING: The branch organisers meeting will be Sat. 1 Dec at the national centre at 11am. The agenda, slightly altered now, includes: 1.Paper sales campaign and recurritment campaign 2.Building the youth organisation (bring your money for outstanding Revolution debts) 3.Next steps in implementing the turn to industry.

NATIONAL SUMMER SCHOOL: As we begin to take education work more seriously, one of the first results will be a national summer school from July 12-18, 1980. The school will be residential, at a conference centre about 30 miles outside London. We are limited to 150 places for this school, so places will be allocated on a first-come, first-served basis. Thirty places will be reserved for youth, however.

For one week, including all meals and accommodation, the total cost will be £47.50p. A £10 deposit will be payable by the end of February, the balance by ONE MONTH before the school. Branches should therefore discuss NOW how to raise money to subsidise the cost of youth conrades attending the school. Branches with problems about this should contact the education dept. or yout dept. at the Centre. The theme of discussions at the school will be "social transformations" concentrating on 20th century revolutions. Further details soon, but deposits can be paid immediatedly.

REVOLUTION CONFERENCE: BIRMINGHAM 14,15 DECEMBER: Branch organisers should be making a final check-list in preparation for the conference. *Have all past and present youth contacts be seed, *Has the branch organisers discussed with each and every student member about their attendance, *Most importantly, have you taken every step to ensure transport is organised so that youth aren't prevented from attending by transport/financial problems!

NEW ISSUE OF REVOLUTION: The theme of Revolution 7 is black liberation. It will be sent out to brances on Wed. 5 December. HOWEVER today the branch debts to Revolution stand at £700!

So., branch organisers will be asked for outstanding monies to be brought to next weekend's Branch Organisers National Meeting. Make sure you bring yours!

And we hope that branches will also be discussing collectively how to sell this new issue. One good way will be to set up meetings around this issue of the paper with the title "Black Liberation and Socialism". Speakers can be arranged with Revolution nationally.

MG NATIONAL CONFERENCE: Two things are vital for the conference preparations to go ahead. First, is the collection of the £6 levy. By now every branch will have taken one discussion about how this is to be collected so that it is not all left to the end, leaving individuals with difficulties.
