They invited him to contact the FSLN leadership and make a peace offering. Amador responded by quiting the SWP faction in Latin America and joining another group headed by Nahuel Moreno where he can find immunity in the factional jungle.

But the SWP's sudden expressions of support for the Iranian Revolution fall to pieces when one notable omission is observed. What do they say about the US hostages at the American embassy? Absolutely nothing!

Yet it was the seizure of the embassy which marked the flashpoint in the deepen-ing of the revolution. On the embassy takeover, centres the struggle for the return of the Shah to stand trial, the removal of the pro-American elements in the American elements in the Tehran government and the mighty blows directed at the base of world imperialism, the US dollar

Hiding behind abstract calls to the Iranian Revolution, the SWP/IMG very deliberately avoid supporting the revolution's demand for the hostages to be tried as members of a 'nest of espionage'. espionage'

Their 'neutrality' on the US hostages is the hallmark of the SWP connection with the CIA-State Department.

This is not the first time that the agents at 'Intercontinental Press' have scuttled one of their agents. It also happened to Fausto Amador,

happened to Fausto Amagor, the agent provocateur who was recruited and trained by the late Joseph Hansen, and given the title of 'leading Latin American Trotskyist'.

For more than 18 months up until the Nicaraguan Revolution Amador, a self-admitted traitor to the Re-

admitted traitor to the Revolution, was given space in 'Intercontinental Press' to attack the Sandinistas accusing them of allowing unnecessary slaughter of the civilian population, adventurism, neglecting the aims of the working class and peasantry, and urging the freedom lighters to surrender!

to the NLF.

All revolutions are great schools of experience for the revolutionary party and the masses of the world. One of the decisive lessons from Iran and Nicaragua is that the revisionist groups are led and controlled by the US State Department.

Abandoned

Just as they abandoned Amador, so they have aban-doned, the SWP, 14,...They can rot in jail so long as the CIA/FBI agents are con-

They are now hailing events in Iran and Nicatagua in a desperate attemp to climb aboard a band to climb aboard a band-wagon. Their aim is thor-oughly professional — it is to secure new ways of sending fresh agents into the field to replace those who have been exposed.

It is the intention of the Workers Revolutionary Par-ty, British section of the In-ternational Committee of the Fourth International, to continue the remorseless inves-tigation of these CIA/FB1 agents and to unmask their whereabouts and their provocations
