6. To seat as fraternal delegates the following categories: (1) National Committee members; (2) members of the National Control Commission; (3) heads of National Office departments; (4) special guests.

- 7. That the following rules apply to convention procedure:
  - a. In cases of procedural disputes, discussion be limited to two speakers, one for and one against, and each speaker be limited to two minutes.

- b. Discussion from the floor shall be limited to 10 minutes per speaker.
- c. A speaker may have the floor only once in a given discussion until all those who wish the floor have had opportunity to speak.
- d. All voting, except for election of
  National Committee and National Control Commission, will be done by voice
  vote unless a division of the house
  is called for; then the vote will be
  taken by a show of delegates cards.
  Election of National Committee and
  National Control Commission shall take
  place by secret ballot.
- e. Only delegates have voice and vote. Fraternal delegates have voice and consultative vote.
- f. Alternate delegates have voice and vote only when acting to replace a regularly elected delegate.
- g. In all other cases, Roberts Rules of Order shall apply.
