Dear Lew:

Last night I received the following telegram from the U.S. Army. Ray has been seriously wounded. The telegram reads:

THE SECRETARY OF THE ARMY HAS ASKED ME TO EXPRESS HIS DEEP REGRET THAT YOUR HUSBAND, SPCIALIST RAYMOND E. ASHLEY WAS PLACED ON THE VERY SERIOUSLY ILL LIST IN VIETNAM ON 1 MARCH 1969 AS A RESULT OF MULTIPLE FRAGMENTS WOUNDS TO THE BACK AND TO THE HEAD, WITH PENETRAT-EXTENT OF BRAIN DAMAGE IS UN-ING FRAGMENT WOUNDS TO THE BRAIN. DETERMINED AT THIS TIME. HE WAS IN COMBAT OPERATION WHEN ENGAGED HOSTILE FORCE IN FIREFIGHT. IN THE JUDGEMENT OF THE ATTENDING PHYSICIAN HIS CONDITION IS OF SUCH SEVERITY THAT THERE IS CAUSE FOR CONCERN. PLEASE BE ASSURED THAT THE BEST MEDICAL FACILITIES AND DOCTORS HAVE BEEN MADE AVAILABLE AND THAT EVERY MEASURE IS BEING TAKEN TO AID HIM. YOU WILL BE KEPT INFORMED OF ANY SIGNIFI-CANT CHANGES IN HIS CONDITION. HE IS HOPITALIZED IN VIETNAM. ADDRESS MAIL TO HIM AT THE HOSPITAL MAIL SECTION APO. SAN FRAN-CISCO 96381. HE WAS WOUNDED ON 28th FEBRUARY.

Today I received letters from Ray written just before his injuries. He reports receiving the Militants; that most of the guys liked the paper; and that they have heard stories about Presidio and about demonstrations in Vietnam.
