In this period of preconvention discussion for the World Congress, it is vital that comrades of the SWP participate in all the debates in t e world movement, even though the SWP is not legally a member of the Fourth International.

The SWP leadership has voted against the line of the majority document on the building of the sections in capitalist Europe. As I a supporter of this document, I believe I have the right to defend it on the branch floor not only here in Philadelphia, but in the other SWP branches as I may desire.

I request that you contact the organizers in the following cities: Boston, New York, Washington, and Philadelphia, and arrange for me to defend the majority document.

I would also appreciate your informing meas to whether you intend to publish or otherwise communicate to comrades any critique of the majority document. I do not consider my defense of the majority line as contingent on the appearance of such a critique, but certainly some statement by you would be helpful in the clarification of issues for the comrades.

Due to reactionary legislation, I do not employ the phrase "tendency for the World Congress discussion", but in-centent if not in form that is what I am declaring.
