# Washington State CP to fight election oath

SEATTLE, Feb. 9—Delegates to the Wasnington State Communist Party Convention, held last week, mapped a campaign to run state candidates along with the national standard bearers, Gos Hall for President and Jarvis Tyner for Vice-President.

BIRMINGHAM, Ala., March I — The Alabama State Commulist Party today filed 6,000 signatures with the secretary of state in a light commercial community of the state ballot.
