Dear Comrade Barsman,

This is in response to your letter of August 30, 1973, to the Political Committee.

Your long list of questions which "naturally" came to mind seem to be predicated upon an erroneous conclusion as to what the convention decided.

The following is the motion adopted by the convention under the point on the world movement:

Motion: To approve the general line of the Political Committee report, including the following:

1. a.) To reaffirm the organisational principles of the SVP as adopted at its 1965 convention and their appliestion to every single member without exception.

b.) To instruct every party unit to apply these principles. c. All transfers in the post-convention period must be

c. All transfers in the post-convention period must be approved by the Mational Committee until it decides otherwise.

2. To end the literary end branch discussion and refer any reopening to the National Committee to be decided in light of the implementation of the unanimous April United Secretarion statement defining the conditions for a democratic and supportative world congress.

3. To continue in an uninterrupted way all international responsibilities including translating and publishing the English-lenguage International Internal Discussion Bulletin for the information of SMP and TSA members as a fraternal courtesy to the United Secretariat of the Fourth International.

4. The convention proposes to the Leminist-Trotskyist Tendency that in the light of the new developments it discuss converting itself from a tendency to a fection.

5. The convention instructs and empowers the incoming National Committee to use all the forces and resources at its command to struggle for a democratic world congress and a Trotskyist Fourth International.

The convention voted neither to effiliete the party to en international faction or tendency nor to require any comrade to support any faction or tendency in the world movement.

The majority causes consists of those comrades who support the platform which defined the majority caucus in the election of delegates prior to the party convention. That platform consisted of the Leminist-Trotskyist Tendency Declaration and the Political Committee Draft Political Resolution.

In answer to a letter from Bill Hassey prior to the convention which reised some of the same questions I wrote:

The national office of the party does not "bear the expenses" of any tendencies, factions or other groups. The national office of the party finances the activities of the party as decided by its elected bodies. The expenses of any tendencies or factions are borne by themselves.

The constitution of the party explains the financial responsibility of membership in Article VII. Section 2.

The resolution on the Organizational Character of the Socialist Workers Party adopted by the 1965 party convention delimits membership responsibilities in a broader framework.
