Dear Frank.

I am writing in response to your letter of September 9, 1973. As I indicated to you in a phone call on the evening of Wednesday, September 12, I would like to request a transfer to the Chicago Branch.

As you remember from a conversation I had with you last spring, I have planned to move to Chicago during the month of September for some time. I made this decision due to personal problems in my immediate family and due to termination of my job with the Oakland School District. I told you at that time that I expected to have to remain inactive for several months because of the considerable number of night and summer courses I have had to take to fulfill Illinois teacher credential requirements.
