

Debby Bustin, 26, is a former national coordinator of the Student Mobilization Committee (SMC), the country's largest student antiwar organization. Her role in the antiwar movement led to her inclusion on Nixon's "enemies list." Bustin is a plaintiff in the Socialist Workers Party and Young Socialist Alliance Watergate suit against the Nixon administration demanding an end to harassment of those opposing government policies.

Leader of Atlanta coalition sponsoring demonstration for the right to abortion; coordinator of Atlanta's August 26th Coalition supporting ratification of the Equal Rights Amendment; ran for mayor of Atlanta, 1973, becoming the first socialist ever to be on the ballot in Atlanta; cochairwoman of the Socialist Workers 1974 National Campaign Committee.

### WHO RULES AMERICA?

POLITICS OF OIL: BEHIND THE ENERGY CRISIS Dick Roberts, an associate editor of the International Socialist Review, holds a B. A. from Columbia University and an M.A. from the University of Wisconsin, Madison. Roberts was the featured speaker in 1972 with William Domhoff at the Corporate War Crimes Investigation. A frequent lecturer at universities across the country, he is currently working on a book titled The Economics of U.S. Imperialism.

Author of: What Socialists Stand For.


## NORMAN OLIVER WATERGATE AND THE BLACK LIBERATION MOVEMENT

Dan Styron has been a leading figure in the socialist movement for almost a decade. He has lectured on Marxist economics, trade-union policy, and U.S. foreign policy throughout the United States and Europe. He participated in the Berkeley Free Speech Movement in 1964 and was a leader of the Berkeley Vietnam Day Committee, which organized the nation's first antiwar teachin in 1965. National committee member of the Socialist Workers Party; candidate for U.S. Senate from California, 1974.

# GEORGE NOVACK HUMANISM AND SOCIALISM REFORM AND REVOLUTION IN AMERICAN HISTORY

Born in Boston in 1905 and educated at Harvard University, George Novack is an outstanding socialist scholar. A collaborator of C. Wright Mills and Ernest Mandel, he has contributed articles to The Nation, The New Republic, the International Socialist Review, and other journals. Former research associate for Fund for the Republic; served on steering committee of Socialist Scholars Conference; lecturer at major universities in the U.S., Canada, and Mexico; active socialist and staunch defender of civil liberties; one of few Marxists listed in WHO'S WHO.

Author of 29 books and pamphlets, including: Understanding History—Marxist Essays; Democracy and Revolution; Empiricism and Its Evolution: A Marxist View; The Origins of Materialism; and An Introduction to the Logic of Marxism. Editor of the popular anthology Existentialism vs. Marxism: Conflicting Views on Humanism.

## FRED HALSTEAD WHEN AMERICA GOES SOCIALIST

Fred Halstead was the 1968 presidential candidate of the Socialist Workers Party. ## FRANK LOVELL STATE OF THE UNIONS: HOW WORKERS CAN FIGHT INFLATION

Frank Lovell is an authority on the labor movement today. As a staff writer and columnist for The Militant newspaper, he covers all major developments in the trade unions. A longtime socialist, Lovell first joined the Workers Party of America in 1935 at the age of 22. Participant in the San Francisco maritime strike, 1936-37; organizer for Seafarer's International Union, 1956-69; member of the United National Caucus while in the UAW. Author of the book Maritime.

## JEFF MACKLER CRISIS IN AMERICAN EDUCATION

A classroom teacher for the past eight years, Jeff Mackler has long been a political activist. While a student at Antioch College he was president of the Antioch Committee for Racial Equality, which led the first Northern civil rights sitin in 1963. A delegate to the past six national conventions of the American Federation of Teachers, he is currently vice-president of the Hayward Federation of Teachers and an appointed member of the Farmworkers Support Committee of the California Federation of Teachers.

## ANDY ROSE THE CRISIS FACING THE U.S. ECONOMY



# MACEO DIXON BLACK POWER: HOW IT WILL BE WON POLICE TERROR IN THE BLACK COMMUNITY: HOW TO FIGHT IT

Maceo Dixon has been a longtime activist in the Black liberation movement. In 1970 he was one of the organizers of the student strike at Highland Park College in Detroit, and in 1971 he helped found the Black Moratorium Committee Against the War. Recently he was a coordinator of the Detroit Black Commission of Inquiry into Police Terror and a leading member of the Coalition to Abolish STRESS, a group that forced the abolition of the police terror unit in Detroit.

Dixon is a plaintiff in the Socialist Workers Party and Young Socialist Alliance Watergate suit against the Nixon administration demanding an end to harassment of those opposing government policies. In the fall of 1973 and spring of 1974, he made national tours speaking on Watergate and the energy crisis.

Ran for mayor of Detroit, 1973; delegate to the National Black Political Convention in Little Rock, Arkansas, 1974; national executive committee member of the Young Socialist Alliance; cochairman of the Socialist Workers 1974 National Campaign Committee.

From 1970-73 Derrick Morrison was a staff writer for The Militant, covering firsthand such events as the Attica prison rebellions and the first Black Political Convention in Gary, Indiana. As a writer and activist she has appeared on Canadian TV and has been interviewed on CBS Radio. A founder of the Third World Women's Alliance, 1970; helped organize the August 26, 1970, Strike for Equality; Socialist Workers Party candidate for Congress from New York, 1974. Currently she is an activist in the Ad Hoc Committee for the Defense of Haitian Refugees.

Coauthor of Black Women's Liberation. Contributor to the anthology Feminism and Socialism.

## DIANNE FEELEY

Currently national organization secretary of the Young Socialist Alliance.





## EVELYN REED WOMEN: FROM FOLLOWERS TO LEADERS FEMINISM AND WOMAN'S BIOLOGY

A widely acclaimed Marxist anthropologist, Evelyn Reed has lectured at 100 universities in the U.S. and Canada. Keynote speaker at Southern Female Rights Union Conference in Mississippi, 1970; participant in Sixth Socialist Scholars Conference in New York, 1970; interviewed as part of educational TV series "Men and Ideas," 1972; an active socialist for more than 30 years.

In 1973 Reed made a speaking tour of Australia, New Zealand, and Japan. She was the first notable spokeswoman for the American feminist movement to undertake an extensive tour in these countries.

Author of the book Problems of Women's Liberation (in its sixth printing, adopted by 45 universities, translated into several languages, and considered one of the principal guides to current theoretical discussion). Has also written Is Biology Woman's Destiny? and An Answer to the Naked Ape and Other Books on Aggression.

## INTERNATIONAL STRUGGLES

## DAVE FRANKEL ISRAEL AND THE ARABS: WHAT SOLUTION TO THE MIDEAST CONFLICT?

Dave Frankel, 26, is a staff writer for The Militant newspaper covering Mideastern and Soviet politics. He has lectured and debated at more than 40 universities on the conflict in the Middle East.

Coauthor of: War in the Middle East: The Socialist View; and The First Three Internationals: Their History and Lessons.

## PETER BUCH PALESTINE: STRUGGLE FOR LIBERATION

Peter Buch fled Nazism with his family during World War II and came to the U.S. As a teenager, Buch was a member of the American section of Hashomer Hatzair, a Zionist youth group, and lived in Israel in 1951. He broke with Zionism in 1952, becoming a Marxist and revolutionary socialist. A founding member of the Young Socialist Alliance, 1960; attended Palestine Week Conference in Algeria, May 1971. An expert on the Middle East, he has lectured and debated frequently at universities in the U.S. and Canada.

Author of: Burning Issues of the Mideast Crisis. Coauthor of: Zionism and the Arab Revolution. Edited and wrote the introduction to Leon Trotsky on the Jewish Question.

## JUDY WHITE PROSPECTS FOR REVOLUTION IN LATIN **AMERICA**

Formerly an anthropology instructor at Boston University, Judy White is now a staff writer covering Latin American politics for the international newsmagazine, Intercontinental Press. As a national spokeswoman for the United States Committee for Justice to Latin American Political Prisoners (USLA) from 1971-74, she traveled to Mexico to obtain the release of exiled Peruvian peasant leader Hugo Blanco in 1971, and again in October, 1973, to meet with Latin Americans forced into exile after the rightwing coup in Chile. She is the former editor of the USLA Reporter, a North American publication dealing with the defense of political prisoners in Latin America.

## ABDEEN JABARA THE MIDEAST SINCE OCTOBER '73: NEW IM-PERIAL PENETRATION


## JOSE G. PEREZ

## BLACK NATIONALISM AND THE REVOLUTION IN MUSIC


