Dear Comrades,

The Communist Party is on a national campaign to organize anti-inflation actions on Saturday, November 16, in more than 30 cities. These actions were initiated by the CP in early October. As the possibility of a mineworkers strike becomes more likely, they have begun to orient some of these actions towards supporting the miners.

A couple of branch organizers have called, giving us information about the actions in their cities and asking about developments in other cities. From reading the <u>Daily World</u> it appears that in some cities they are obtaining relatively broad endorsements and participation from unions, consumer organizations, tenant groups, etc.

In Pittsburgh, for example, they report that the mayor of McKeesport, Pa., a small steel town, and Louis Antal, head of District 5 of the United Mine Workers, will be speaking at the rally. Several unions have endorsed the action there. In Denver, the call for the action included the Crusade for Justice and the Colorado Federation of Teachers. In Philadelphia, the Daily World reports that UMW president Arnold Miller will be speaking at the rally.

We don't have a complete list of the cities where actions are scheduled. They key ones we know are: New York, Detroit, Chicago, Cleveland, Milwaukee, Pittsburgh, Philadelphia, San Antonio, Denver, San Francisco.

Comrades should check around to see if actions are occuring in your cities, how much support they're getting, and to participate in them if possible. These actions will also provide opportunities for Militant sales. Please send the national office reports on how these actions are shaping up.
