1. NATIONAL COORDINATORS

There shall be approximately ten national coordinators, based in New York City (with the exception of Patti Miller who shall be based in Chicago) who will have the duty of overseeing the day-to-day functioning of the Student Mobilization Committee. The coordinators shall be a politically broad group, representative of the breadth of the Student Mobilization Committee. The coordinators shall be responsible to the Working Committee and to higher bodies of the Student Mobilization Committee.

2. WORKING COMMITTEE

There shall be a Working Committee of approximately 25 people, based in New York City, which shall be representative of the groups working in the Student Mobilization Committee. This body shall be responsible for making tactical and procedural decisions between meetings of the National Steering Committee, and shall be responsible to the National Steering Committee. It shall have the power to expand both itself and the national coordinators to ensure both bodies being représentative.

3. NATIONAL STEERING COMMITTEE

There shall be a National Steering Committee which shall have the highest authority in the Student Mobilization Committee between national conferences. It shall be composed so that it is both geographically and politically representative of the breadth of the Student Mobilization Committee. It shall have the power to expand itself to ensure this preadth.
