Motion: To propose the following organizational motions to the National Committee:

- 1. Motion: To approve the agenda as written (attached).
- 2. Motion: To approve the schedule as written (attached).
- 3. Motion: That the presiding committee consist of: Finkel, Fowlkes, Miah, Miller, Mirelowitz, Pulley, Rose, Ugolini, Vidal, Welch.
- 4. Motion: To adopt the following rules for the convention:
 - a. That procedural questions be decided by majority vote with one speaker for and one against, each with one minute.
 - b. That all sessions be open with the exception of the session on the Zanellotti Appeal and the Election of the National Committee.

- c. That the National Committee be elected by secret ballot.
- d. That alternate delegates seated in the place of absent delegates have voice and vote. That consultative delegates have voice and consultative vote. That fraternal delegates have voice and no vote. That special guests have no voice and no vote, although greetings may be delivered upon approval of the convention.
- e. That discussion presentations be limited to seven minutes.
- f. That in any discussion period, no one may speak a second time before each person desiring the floor has had a chance to speak.
- g. That only those delegates seated at the roll call of a particular session may vote.
- 5. Motion: That consultative delegates be the outgoing members of the National Committee and those comrades who are not on the National Committee who work in the YSA National Office.
- 6. Motion: That fraternal delegates be representatives of YSJP chapters in areas where no YSA locals exist.
- 7. Motion: That special guests be one representative from each organization invited to attend the convention, and designated representatives from the Socialist Workers Party and organizations of our co-thinkers abroad.
- 8. Motion: That there be a Nominating Commission composed as follows: 3 delegates from the New England region, 3 from the New York region, 3 from the Midwest region, 2 from the Southern California region, 2 from the Northern California region, 2 from the Ohio region, 2 from the Texas region, 1 from the Michigan region, 1 from the Pennsylvania region, 1 from the Maryland-Virginia region, 1 from the Southeast region, 1 from the Oregon region, 1 from the Washington region, 1 from the Rocky Mountain region, and 1 from the Upper Midwest region.

- 9. Motion: That the Nominating Commission be chaired by Gersh, Chicago, and Chainey, Lower Manhattan, each with voice and no vote.
- 10. Motion: That Johnston, Upper West Side, and Friedman, Brooklyn, be the two convention secretaries.
- 11. Motion: That Tracy, Boston, chair a Constitution Commission of three people, the other two to be elected by the convention.
- 12. Motion: That Freiwirth, Upper West Side, chair a Credentials Commission of six people, the other five to be elected by the convention.
- 13. Motion: That the media be allowed to cover all open sessions of the convention.
