I love you Better than Mary does or any Body else in the world that is why i am tell ing you of this thing i was drunk at the time and did not know what i was doing i know it was wrong too let those Negroes die on account of me i hope you will believe my statement Because it is the gods truth i hope you will be lieve me i was jazed but those White Boys jazed me i wish those Negroes are not Burnt on account of me it is those White Boys fault that is my statement and that is all i know i hope you tell the law hope you will answer.
