Memorandum for Mr. Keohan.

I am attaching hereto a table of statistics prepared by me upon the results of the raid of the UNION OF RUSSIAN WORKERS, from which you will note that an excellent record has been made by the agents of the Bureau of Investigation in the arrests in these matters. The reports from all districts relative to the number ordered deported seems to be most satisfactory, with

the exception of the reports from Chicago, where out of 35 cases heard none have as yet been ordered deported and there are still pending 22 cases of the 35.
