Kindly submit by wire the following motion to the members of the new National Executive Committee just elected through referendum vote of the Party membership:

**NEC Motion
by Katterfeld.**

“That the newly elected National Executive Committee meet at the National Office in Chicago, Tuesday, July 1st [1919] at 10 am.”

Comment.

I urge a meeting of the new NEC at this earliest possible date so that without loss of time

we may call a halt to the party wrecking activities of the expiring committee and begin in earnest the work of organization and education that must be done before the Socialist Party of the United States can grapple successfully with the tremendous problems that confront it.
