

CONVICT ROCKEFELLERS FOR CRIMES COMMITTED IN COLORADO

THE Rockefeller have already been found guilty of every awful crime charged against them. They have been convicted at the court of public opinion as a result of the testimony produced before the United States Commission on Industrial Relations.

This is not a conclusion reached by Socialists. It is the declaration of Frank P. Walsh, chairman of the commission, which was appointed by President Wilson.

What is Colorado going to do about it? Colorado has indicted, convicted and sentenced to life imprisonment John R. Lawson, the official of the United Mine Workers, who led the workers' revolt in that state. What is Colorado going to do to the Rockefeller, who led the forces of greed in the war to keep the workers enslaved, and in carrying on that war committed every crime possible against human freedom, even to the slaughtering of innocent children.

PROVE RESPONSIBILITY.

The United States Commission on Industrial Relations has ended its hearings. From his home in Kansas City, Chairman

Walsh declares that the commission "has proved the absolute responsibility of Mr. John D. Rockefeller, Jr., himself for everything that happened in Colorado." He added that the men who led the Colorado strike were fighting the same fight for liberty "against an enemy as powerful and menacing as any ever faced by our revolutionary forefathers." He also attacked John D. Rockefeller, and said the Colorado strike was typical of other labor clashes.

"The record of the Washington hearing of the commission," said Chairman Walsh, "is remarkable, in my mind, chiefly because every major indictment brought against the Rockefellers, father and son, as well as the other coal operators working with them in Colorado, by the bitterest of agitators, has been proved out of the lips of John D. Rockefeller, Jr., or the men whom he hires to carry out the joint wills of his father and himself; in most instances backed up by the letters over the signatures of these men.

LISTS CHARGES "PROVED."

"POLITICAL DOMINATION, intimidation of the governor, contempt for government and the American people as a whole, the prostitution of the state to private interests, an utter contempt and

disregard for the state and federal constitutions as well as for statute laws, the horror of the Ludlow massacre, the exploitation of helpless miners by economic pressure, and the vilest forms of larceny; the attempt to make it appear that the coal companies had met in conference representatives of the strikers, when such was not the case; the carefully organized and extensive campaign undertaken to deceive the people—all these have been established beyond all doubt from the testimony of John D. Rockefeller, Jr., and his personal lieutenants.

"ABOVE ALL, THE COMMISSION HAS PROVED THE ABSOLUTE RESPONSIBILITY OF JOHN D. ROCKEFELLER, JR., HIMSELF FOR EVERYTHING THAT HAPPENED IN COLORADO.

"W. L. Mackenzie King, former labor commissioner of Canada and at present an employee of the Rockefeller Foundation, boasted, while giving his testimony, that the will and conscience of John D. Rockefeller, Jr., was more potent in Colorado than all the public opinion of all the people of the United States, and that the American people must look to that man for an improvement of conditions, conced-

ed by all to be un-American and intolerable.

RECALLS 700,000 CHILD DEATHS.

"IF THE COLORADO record were not sufficient to give us the color and bent of the mind of John D. Rockefeller, Jr., we should still have a perfect record of his mental processes in the article by Professor Stevenson, which he indorsed as 'one of the soundest and most forcible presentations on the subject of capital and labor he had ever seen.'

"Mr. Rockefeller's persistent effort to conceal from the public his true thought has failed as a result of the revelation. It does no injustice to the spirit of the article which Mr. Rockefeller so lavishly praises to call attention to that portion of it in which Professor Stevenson conceded, for the sake of argument, that 700,000 little children die annually in America on account of under-nourishment of themselves or their parents, and asserts that their deaths must be conceded to be a blessing to themselves and to the community, adding that 'such children should not have been born,' and 'unskilled labor is mere animated machinery.'

STRIKE LIKE REVOLUTION.

"WITH THE record of the Colorado

investigation before them the American people will be blind indeed if they fail to see the folly of trusting to the good intentions and the philanthropic impulses of men like the Rockefellers and if they do not realize that the men who lead a strike such as that of the miners of Colorado are fighting the same old fight for liberty and democracy against an enemy as powerful and menacing as any ever faced by our revolutionary forefathers.

"WITH THE CLOSE OF THE WASHINGTON HEARING THE COMMISSION HAS PRACTICALLY COMPLETED ITS INVESTIGATION OF THE COLORADO STRIKE. "I FAVORED the commission probing

to the bottom this particular social cancer because I realized that the struggle in Colorado was not local or peculiar in character but presented, as it were, a great laboratory in which every angle of the labor problem could be observed and studied.

"In my opinion the indisputable facts developed furnish a striking illustration of what happens anywhere when the workers in their struggle for economic freedom run counter to the financial interests and to the love of arbitrary power of such men as Messrs. Rockefeller."

LOWER MORTAL BEINGS NEVER SANK

Significance of the Closing Incident of Michigan's Tragic Copper Strike Told by Debs in His Own Matchless Language—What Will You Do to Aid these Ten Thousand Miserable Slaves?

THE FOLLOWING associated press dispatch is the last tragic echo of the crushing defeat sustained by the union miners in the strike in the upper peninsula of Michigan: "Calumet, Mich., May 28th.—A memorial thanking James McNaughton, general manager of the Calumet and Hecla Mining Company, for his firmness in refusing to yield to the demands of the union in the copper strike a year ago, was presented McNaughton tonight, signed by the ten thousand employees of the company. The memorial contains the signatures of every employee and expressed appreciation for the half million dollar bonus promised them June 15th by the company.
Do you catch the true meaning, the full significance of this closing incident of the tragic strike of a year ago?
Can you see these ten thousand miserable slaves pouring out their thanks to the tyrant who assailed their union, assailed, beat up and attempted to murder their leaders and then drove them out of the state; the tyrant who is responsible for the murder of nearly a hundred babes that never-to-be-forgotten Christmas eve?
Lower than these slaves are pictured in the dispatch no mortal beings were ever sunk to the world hegan. Scabbing at its worst is nothing but a virtue compared to what they are here doing at its best.
DO NOT JUDGE TOO HARSHLY.
BUT DO NOT judge these wretched slaves harshly for such may be said in mitigation of their felonious debasement. They did not know this so-called memorial. Of course not. They were down low enough, God knows, without sinking deeper in their degradation and without trying to public their gratitude to the author.
THIS LITTLE SCHEME WAS ENGINEERED BY THE CALUMET AND HECLA UNION-CRUSHING, MOB INCITING, MURDERING CORPORATION AND ITS OFFICIALS, AND QUITE POSSIBLY BY McNAUGHTON HIMSELF.
This filthy "memorial" McNaughton is presented, glorified and made to appear immaculate, but only a mental cripple will be deceived.
It must have been a bitter pill to many a slave of the Calumet and Hecla but they had to swallow it. They had to publicly lick their master's hand like dogs for the (bone) he flung them, and thank him for having destroyed their union, mobbed their leaders, murdered their children, robbed them of their self-respect, ravaged their manhood, sunk them to the depths of degradation and finally certify to all the world that they were profoundly grateful for their slavery and degradation.

SOCIALIST POSITION IS SUSTAINED

Great Story of How Young Rockefeller Was Unmasked—Managing Editor of "New York Call," Who Was on the Spot, Analyzes Work of Industrial Commission for the American Socialist

SO MANY volumes of facts were brought out during the last public hearing held by the United States Commission on Industrial Relations in Washington that it is difficult to know how to sift from the mass the few most vital points. Here, in this hearing at the nation's capital, under the shadow of the dome and just a half dozen blocks from the White House, was the climax of two years of work. Here was the whirlwind finish down the home stretch. Here they put on the speed and went driving to the heart of things. Here they scored their home run.
Of course the examination of Rockefeller and his paid satellites was the great feature of the hearing. Seldom is one compelled to witness such brazen insolence, such "you can't hurt me" bravado, such "what-are-you-going-to-do-about-it" defiance. Rockefeller, master of millions of dollars and millions of men, cold, shifty, emotionless, eternally dodging and evading, attempting to apply an impudently Sunday school manner on the surface to his conduct on the stand, the while palpably lying and twisting. Ivy Leagueshrewd press agent, primacing, smirking, brazen as the most painted lady on Broadway. W. L. MacKenzie King, like nothing more than a young up-start whom one would like to chastise and send to bed, but secure in the employment of the Rockefeller Foundation, for which he is the hired "investigator" of industrial conditions. There was a challenging note of insult about this person who, by heaven knows what freak of chance, once was labor commissioner of Canada. L. M. Bowers, the man who helped to do the dirty work in Colorado. There they were, one after the other, showing us in actuality the human equation that we have got to deal with in our fight against the capitalist system.
IT'S THEIR MONEY POWER.
AS FOR BRAINS—those wonderfully superior brains that we hear so much about—they didn't seem to be present. These men are not fools, it is true, but what also is true is that they are no more intelligent, no more brainy, than thousands upon thousands of other men. They cannot claim "superior" brains, by any manner of means. They are just ordinarily intelligent men who are entrenched and surrounded and buttressed by the enormous power of overwhelming wealth. There is the power of economic control, not the power of overmastering intellect.
THESE MEN DOMINATE A GREAT PART OF THE CAPITALIST SYSTEM, AND OTHER MEN MUCH LIKE THEM DOMINATE THE BALANCE OF IT. IT'S THEIR MONEY POWER, THEIR PAPER TITLES, THEIR ECONOMIC CONTROL, THAT MAKES THEM STRONG—AND THAT MAKES THEM ENEMIES OF THE COMMON WELFARE.
Never was that more clearly shown than in this hearing. Never was the Socialist position more completely sustained. We found in this hearing that capitalism is just what we have said it was and that it operates just as we have said it operates. The value of this hearing is in the fact that it has brought out OFFICIALLY everything that we have said and repeated for years. Through regular and official channels we now have THE PROOF for every claim that we have ever made.

EVEN PRESIDENT RIDICULED.
This is no longer theory. It is fact. It came out in testimony and it is in the stenographic record for those who care to see in detail. And just by way of suggestion, the Socialist party could have no better propaganda than the verbatim testimony of Rockefeller, if it could be produced in book form. The whole infamous story is there.
In this testimony we have the capitalist system in epitome. The bloody story of Rockefeller and Colorado typifies the whole system. And never can we gain freedom until we have liberated ourselves from masters such as rule Colorado. The greed for profit drove these private owners to the last ditch in their war on labor. Human life and human happiness were as nothing in the fight for plunder.
LAST CRUSHING LINK.
AND THE LAST crushing link of evidence against Rockefeller—yes, Rockefeller personally came when it was shown, and admitted, that Rockefeller KNEW IN ADVANCE of the formation of the now famous Troop A, Colorado National Guard. This troop was recruited from mine employes, such as superintendents, office employes and GUNMEN. These gunmen were brought into Colorado to "protect property," which means to kill strikers. This troop was organized to give military sanction to the slaughters done by these Hessians of industry. As soldiers they were above the law in their murders. They were privately owned soldiers, but under the protection of the state, as regular militiamen. And Rockefeller knew in advance that this troop was being formed, he knew how it was being paid, from whence recruited—AND FOR WHAT PURPOSE. It was this troop that rioted in the blood of Ludlow. THESE WERE THE LUDLOW BUTCHERS.
NOT ONLY DID ROCKEFELLER KNOW ABOUT THIS, BUT LATER HE WROTE TO L. M. BOWERS, ONE OF HIS DENVER SATELLITES, "WE ARE WITH YOU IN EVERYTHING YOU DO."
THAT IS CAPITALISM!
THERE IS capitalism. And it is no different here than it is anywhere else. Under capitalism those things which all of us must have are being brought under the ownership and control of a handful of men. To retain this control, to make profits as large as possible, these men will do WHATEVER IS NECESSARY. This is so everywhere. An official of the Pennsylvania

There is but one big, effective peace force in the world. This great power is the Socialist movement. This is even acknowledged by the capitalist press as the standard in Europe continues. The capitalist press scoffed and sneered because the Socialist movement is the only force that has the courage to face the present catastrophe. But they now see in the Socialist movement the only hope of a definite peace and a pathway against future wars. They see the masses of the world turning to Socialism with the passing of this war.

This feeling in the ranks of non-Socialism was well voiced by Edwin Davis Schenck, in his article in the Century Magazine, republished in The American Socialist. It is being expressed in editorials appearing daily in non-Socialist publications all over the country.

Socialism has been otherwise defined to be a consistent endeavor to substitute for the anarchical competition of to-day the organized co-operation of to-morrow. The British Government has interfered for the stern repression of competition, "anarchical" or otherwise. It has fixed the rates of marine insurance; taken possession of the agencies of railway transportation and regulated freight charges; placed a limit to the price of food, and has transformed private factories into Government workshops when the necessities of the State seemed to demand it.

IT IS DIFFICULT to estimate the importance of The Hague dispatch in which it is stated that the Socialists of Germany are making an earnest effort to find a basis on which a coalition of the war can be brought about. The dispatch came by way of London, and may have been tampered with, and it isn't known whether the peace movement has the sympathy of German Socialists generally. It seems that the German Socialists are striving to get in touch with the Socialists of Great Britain and France with the view of interesting them in it.

THE RECORDERS' HALL at 111 West 42nd Street, New York, is the headquarters of the Socialist movement in this city. The hall is a large, well-lit room with a high ceiling and a large window that looks out onto the city street. The atmosphere is one of quiet activity and purpose.

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GERMAN WORKERS FOR PEACE. (From The People's Voice, Capital.) GERMAN SOCIALISTS have sent a delegate to Amsterdam to get into touch with representatives of Dutch, French and British Socialists with the object of bringing about peace. The German Social Democrats are said to be unanimous for withdrawal from Belgium. At the same time they are not for a Belgian indemnity. French and English labor leaders agree almost entirely with the German Socialist peace program, which includes a restoration to all the belligerent countries of their territorial possessions as they stood before war began, together with the neutralization of all strategic waterways, as the straits of Gibraltar, the Kiel canal, Suez, the Dardanelles and the Bosporus, and a prohibition in Russia, Germany and Austria of the use of their territory as a base for their future aggression and government.
