### Southern Commission Exposed as Aid Of the Bosses in Lynch Terror Drive

A challenge has gone from the League of Struggle for Negro Rights to the Southern Commission on the Study of Lynching, whose meeting in Atlanta this week has done its best to whitewash the lynchers, disarm the Negro masses against a real anti-lynching struggle, and put the seal of its approval on legal lynchings con-

ducted by the boss courts.

The National Executive Committee of the L.S.N.R. denounces the commission as an instrument of the Southern ruling class and challenges the members of the Commission to defend their false findings before the Negro and white masses.

The letter to the commission reads as follows:

'The summary of the findings of your Commission in the press declares that the number of lynchings has decreased. This is a deliberate distortion accomplish by ignoring the enormous increase of lynchings in this year. Your further declaration that Many arrests have been made and only 21 lynchings occurred last year is also a distortion the cops are trying to frame one of fact. "We accuse your commission of bringing in a report intended to deceive and disarm the masses in their vig-ilance against the intended legal lynchings of the innocent Negro boys falsely convicted at Scottsboro, the intended legal lynchings of Willie Peterson at Birmingham, and of Orphan Jones at Snow Hill, Maryland, as well as others.

"Press reports do not show that you even mention the Scottsboro case, elthough you are well aware that this is the outstanding case of the present moment of legal lynching in a court house surounded by a mob entertained by a brass band.

"We challenge your commission publicly to present, through a representative of your Commission, your false findings and hypocritical propaganda before the Negro and white masses in New York, Philadelphia, Chicago, Cleveland or any other large city in the north where Negroes, although severely persecuted, are not entirely prevented from holding meeting as they are in your kingdom of lynch law. If you refuse to accept challenge for a northern city, we are ready to undertake a debate in any other of the cities of the South, such as Chattanooga, in spite of the greater degree of intimidation.

#### Southern Liberals Defense of Lynching

In another part of this issue of the SOUTHERN WORKER we publish a statement by the National Executive Committee of the League of Struggle for Negro Rights that rips the hypocritical masks off the faces of th liberal gang who recently published a statement purporting to deal with lynching in the South. It is an indictment that should be spread throughout the entire South as it will expose to the Negro and white workers precisely what a fithy role these people play who pretend to condemn lynching in words but who in reality defend the institution of lynching—legal

ord occurs in the report of the "liberals" regarding the guilt of political and civic leaders and police and sheriffs who deliberately fo-ment lynching campaigns against Negro workers and farmers. The organneed of the course of the cour ory in the South are known. Without exception, in cases of particles, if taken from jails and lynched, the sheriffs and jailers were accomplices, if not actual instigators of the crimes. Yet the report says nothing about these facts. Nor does the report deal in any way with the hundreds of lynchings that are hushed up. In all cities of the South policemen regularly eat into insensibility Negro workers in the streets and frequently inflict injuries that result in death-yet these brutal killings are not recorded as "natural causes" or from "alcoholism" or some other handy lie.

Nothing is said in the hypocritical report about how the authorities the so-called defendess of "legal procedure" organize and carry on cam-

paigns for weeks on end in order to whip up lynch fury as Mayor Bass, Sheriff Taylor and Judge Fleming are doing at the present time in Chattanooga because they hope thereby to be able to crush the growing unity of white and Negro workers especially in fighting against evictions and because they want to aid the Alabama lynch gang in their frame-up against the Scottosboro boys and against Willie Peterson by crushing with police terror the movement against all lynching, whether carried out by mob violence or by framed-up court trials.

The League of Struggle for Negro Rights challenges the authors of the fake report to a public debate in some northern city and proposes that if they refuse a northern debate it shall be held in the South. Undoubtedly, if these scoundrels and defenders of the lynch gang pretend to accept such a challenge they will prefer the South because they can rely their friends, the lynch gang, to prohibit the holding meeting. The lynch gang will not permit their good and faithful servants in the camp of the liberals to be exposed and held up to ridicule if they

Lynching can be stopped. But it can only be stopped through unity of action of white and Negro workers and farmers in the industries and on the land. By building powerful organizations that fight for economic demands and wage a political struggle for free speech, free press, the right of assembly, the right to organize and strike the masses can carry on an effective fight against lynching. Such action, combined with the creation of strong defense organizations among the workers and farmers can defeat the lynch gang.

By exposing the double-faced role of the liberals and riddling their lying report on lynching the League of Struggle for Negro Rights has made an important and lasting contribution to the fight against the insti-
