

Smash The Lynching Campaign

One of the most horrible and ghastly lynchings in all the bestial annals of ruling class violence occurred last Thursday in Salisbury, Maryland. Mack Williams, a Negro worker, had offended his boss by daring to protest against his wages being stolen. The slave-driving boss, Daniel J. Elliott, replied by shooting the worker. Although severely wounded the Negro was able to grapple with the murderous boss and in the scuffle the boss was fatally shot.

Because he refused to stand still and be shot to death by the labor exploiter and petty thief, Elliott, the mill bosses and business men organized a mob and, afer savagely torturing the wounded Negro, lynched him. The lynching was accompanied, as usual, by a campaign of terror against the entire Negro working class population. The details of the monstrous crime at Salisbury are published elsewhere in the SOUTHERN WORKER.
