ican Legion and every other male citizen of the United States should enroll for the test September 12."



The wages they pay are higher during the summer when one works like a horse, but in the winter time they regularly lay off all help and don't give us more than 3 or 4 days' work a week. So that thruout the year the average wage does not amount to

Girls and Boys Average \$15. "The company is not even satisfied to pay these miserably low wages. employ young girls and boys in the packing and other departments where they pay no more than \$16; some getting as low as \$14 average wages. Married women get no more than \$18 and in the winter time they complying with the law. "Despite the low wages they pay the workers, the company never pays maneged to get two of them to join Union Educational League. for legal holidays when the factory is closed. This means more wages taken out of the pockets of the em ployees.

ployee when I hope that it will result in making the public alive to the beaasily exploitation and make the men get together to demand their "The heat, flour, and sugar dust keeps men constantly on the sick list, and eats juto their body in a short time. Flat footedness, varicose veins kidney and eye trouble, and tubercu losis are common allments of the men. These diseases take away many years of a man's life and eat up a good deal of the low wages in doctor bills, but the company does not give any vacation to the workers. Fore men and superintendents, however get other treatment.

Spying Maintained.

"Organization among the men is taboo. The company spends thousands of dollars annually to prevent organization of any kind apringing up among the men. No voluntary organ itation even of a fraternal character is allowed. The company employs industrial uples to keep watch upon any altempt of the workers to organize for the purpose of improving their conditions. The men know the injustice of this and of course, would like to get at heast su decent a wage as the drivers of the company who are union men.

"These union men get princely wages in comparison to our starvation e. Abolition of piece work and rates. Those working on single trucks t \$38 a week, while those on the big trucks receive \$44 a week, all year around. They work eight hours a day outside, and do not have the rotten conditions to put up with that we do. The company makes every effort to prevent the other workers from getting at least as decent wages and conditions as these organized union New Branch of the men. Of course, they also would want to bust up the drivers' union if they could do so.

"The inner Seal."

"While the company prohibits any attempt on the part of the men to get together or any shadow of an organ ization it encourages the foremen and the superintendents to come together. The "inner Scal" is the organization of the white uniform and the Palm Beach. It meets monthly and its-activities are devoted in get ting greater loyalty from these watch dogs of the company's profits. It ereates a consciousness of solidarity of interests between these men and the bosses which the workers feel. Sinvedriving is the result, encouraged by the company which made a profit of \$12,000,000 last year.

In the time from the Third World Congress to the S1st of May, 1924, i. e., during a period of 18 months, the Executive Committee of the Young Communist International held 15: sessions in which 1,662 points were on the agenda. Of the 903 times that the various countries were discussed the United States, numerically, appears fourth on the ilst. Germany comes first with 80 points, Italy second with 87 points, Czeche-Sjevakia third with 48 points and the United States fourth with 46 points.

During the same period America sent 151 letters and reports to the Executive Committee and got 64 communications from the Executive Committee in return. In May, 1923, the Executive Committee of the Young Communist International sent one representative to America, Comrade Bammatter, who remained here for a period of 37 days.

Of the most important executive Committee publication in the English language, the United States comes first with a distribution of 7,218 copies, England second with 3,085 copies, Canada third with 1,767 copies, South Africa fourth with 1,112 copies, and Australia fifth with 500 copies.
