possible and public statements, mass petitions and mass demonstrations must be organised. The reports of all such activities must be sent to our Party organs and the Daily Papers, particularly to 'Swadhinata', 'Swaraj', 'Nationalist', 'Advance' etc. for publication.

Appendix II

JUNE' 3 DECLARATION

(Resolution adopted in the C. C. Plenum at Gauhati
in June-July '47.)

This Plenum of C. C. B. P. I condemns the June 3 plan of British Imperialism to divide on religious grounds the entire Indian soil and create two opposite centres in India forcing unwilling nationalities to join the same old Macaulean policy of divide and rule.

In the opinion of this Plenum, the National Congress in accepting the plan has let down all the revolutionary aspirations of the Indian people, watered down the demand of complete independence, has accepted the ignorable position of a British Dominion, reduced itself to the position of a Hindu organisation, thrown the nationalist Muslims to the wolves, given an opportunity to the reactionary Feudal lords to declare their paramountcy and evolve a "Rajasthan"a confederation of feudal states, and, in flee, has played the second fiddle to British Imperia'ism and its camp follower, the Muslim League. Despite the strongest attempt of British Imperialism, Congress and the Muslim League to impose the devilish plan on the Indian people, this Plenum reiterates its o fundamental opposition to the British Plan and calls upon all the progressive forces in India to create such national situation that the operation of the plan is

thawerted, the Imperialism is liquidated and a fully democratic India is evolved. To do that the Plenum resolves to rouse the suppressed nationalities to struggle for their self determination.

This Plenum, therefore, reiterates its support for sovereign Bengal, a sovereign Punjab, a sovereign Pathanisthan, a United Maharastra and so on and so forth. This Plenum appeals to the peole of India not to lose heart because of the forced communal partition of their land of toil and birth.

This Plenum is of firm conviction that very soon the naked and gruesome realities of the situation will come to light and the masses carried for the moment by religious fanaticism will be set a-thinking. Therefore, the Plenum urges on the progressive India to ceaselessly carry on propaganda against the communal division, for self-determination of nationalities on linguistic and cultural basis with the right of cessation and voluntary unification based on mutual advantage, utilise every opportunity of mass discontent for rousing the masses against the States and bring about a national and effective collaboration of the struggling masses of different states and territories for their liberation. With that very end in view the States' people should be helped to rise against their autocratic rulers to end feudalism and establish democracy in the States.

It is true that due to the betrayal of the Congress and the League, the masses of the peasantry and middle classes have fallen to-day an easy prey to the imperialist trap and are not coming out in a militant movement for the forcible overthrow of imperialism. But in the opinion of this Plenum the entire tide can be turned by organised proletariat through ceaseless class struggles and mass struggles for land, bread and freedom.

This Plenum, therefore, resolves to launch economic and political struggles of the classes and the masses on living issues on as widest a scale as

possible, to link them up with States' peoples' movements and lead all these into a revolutionary crusade against imperialism, capitalism and feudalism, end them to establish a fully democratic, workers' and peasants' government in India.

## Appendix III ON 15TH AUGUST CELEBRATION (Circular To All Party Committees)

The Congress and the Muslim League have respectively decided to celebrate August 15, 1947, as Indian Independence Day and Pakistan Independence Day. The Congress and League Governments at the Centre and in the Provinces are already making grand preparations for celebrating the day and the Congress and League Papers are crying hoarse appealing to the people at large for making the celebrations a great success. A day of real independence or deliverence brings about spontaneous rejoicings and jubilations among the broad masses of the people. But we find no such thing in India to-day contrary the approach of 15th August is creating more and more fear and uneasiness among the people as they feel that the day may see more spilting of internecine blood all over the land. Why is it so? It is so because the constitutional changes that will be inaugurated in India on the 15th of August will not serve the best interests of the Indian masses. It will only divide India into communally separated hostile states and will retain the economic and military stranglehold of British imperialism over the whole country in collaboration with the native vested interests within the frame-work of the British commonwealth.
